Components: all six (6) are required as components within the instructional methods

- **Component 1:** Sector Strategy
- **Component 2:** Multiple Entry and Exit Points for Participants
- **Component 3:** Partner Involvement, including key employer partners;
- **Component 4:** Comprehensive Support Services;
- **Component 5:** Navigation; and
- **Component 6:** Contextualized Education



INTEGRATED

Required Elements of Integrated Education Instruction:

- All six (6) career pathway components listed above
- Courses build toward certificates, diplomas, and/or degrees and lead to employment in the identified key industry sector of the region
- Results in industry-recognized credentials as defined by the Department of Labor
- Integrated program model results in college credit(s) in the career pathway

FT employment after training



BRIDGE

Required Elements of Bridge Instruction:

- All six (6) career pathways components listed above
- Course(s) developed with partners
- Provides foundational skills in reading, writing and math within identified occupational or sector context
- Introduces foundational concepts within specific career pathway(s)

Typical Elements of Bridge Instruction:

- Course(s) typically delivered by or with Adult Basic Education (ABE)

ON RAMP

Required Elements of Ramp Instruction

- All six (6) career pathway components listed above.
- Course(s) developed with partners
- Pre-employment services such as the following but not limited to:
 - › Assessment and testing
 - › Vocational counseling
 - › Resume development
 - › Interviewing practice
 - › Job seeking and job sustainability methods
 - › Assistance in applying for remedial or higher education
- Contextualized Instruction to build foundational academic skills
- Training provided (by any of the partners involved) that results in stackable and/or portable credentials geared toward entry-level positions in a key industry sector

Employed FT or PT with continued help from provider.



Employed PT and continuing CP for training.
