

Will the citizenship process be changing again?


Do we ask them for their documentation status upon registration?

Is there a legal obligation to:

- Be Interviewed
- Verify the learner is present
- Share paper or electronic records on students
- Escort to or page the learner
- Provide information on the learner's relationship with our organization, etc.

Dealing with ICE

- Private institutions can limit their space and require warrants signed by a judge
- Do not lie or run away. Do not advise students to lie or run away.
- Ask to see, and make a copy of or note, the officer's credentials (name and badge number), and the phone number their supervisor.
- Ask the officer for their reason for being at your site and document it.
- Ask the officer to produce any documentation that authorizes access.
- If someone at your site is detained, ask where they will be held and get the contact information for their family, particularly if they have children.

In Summary:




- No changes to Adult Education funding as of this check-in.
 Adult Education in MN is primarily funded through state funding.
 Individual federal programs are subject to changes.
- All adults in MN communities are eligible for Adult Education. The only student data required is what is mandatory in SiD.

Guidance from Keith Ellison for K-12 Schools

 Suspension of the Resettlement Program means that we expect fewer new people coming to MN, but the immigration statuses of your students right now have not changed.

Questions about speaking to students

 What should I tell my students who are afraid to come to come to school?

 What can we do as educators to ease the fears and anxiety of these families?

Make sure students know about executive orders that may affect them and their classmates.

Find reliable sources to keep up to date with changes and share them.

Be prepared emotionally for the worst, but combat fear with solidarity. Give example of the ongoing fight, like legal challenges to the executive orders.

Collaborate on a response or a project related to the issues that impact the students.

Work together in your classroom, program, or consortium on a response.



Question 2: What resources would benefit you and your program?

- Know your rights information for students
- Know your rights information for workplace/teachers/etc
- Accurate up-to-date information
- Legal resources
- Emotional/mental health resources
- Talking points to speak with legislators

- create inclusive and supportive classrooms where all students feel welcomed and valued
- prioritize information literacy to combat conspiracy theories and misinformation
- ensure that our programs provide clear and accurate scientific information about climate change and how it impacts students' lives
- combat religious discrimination in all its forms, including Islamophobia and anti-Semitism, by actively teaching and upholding the right to freedom of religion
- acknowledge the growing number of Trans and Gender Nonconforming individuals and committing to explicitly welcoming and supporting the Queer community in our programs
- ensure students have access to comprehensive, accurate, and unbiased information about sexual and reproductive health, including birth control and other health options, regardless of changing federal policies
- actively teach U.S. history that centers BIPOC voices and experiences to oppose anti-Black and Brown policies such as book bans, anti-DEI curricula, and police brutality
- recognize the diverse needs of students with disabilities and advocate for better funding to ensure appropriate accommodations are available to all learners
- advocate for the rights of incarcerated students and returning citizens,
 ensuring they have access to quality education and the resources needed to thrive
- decolonize our curriculum and programs by centering indigenous voices, rights, and stewardship of land and water, and also dismantling white supremacist policies
- strengthen and form relationships with community partners to ensure emergency plans are in place before anticipated legislation goes into effect, so response can be immediate

Statement 2025

- commitment for individuals and/or programs
- can guide curriculum development, professional development and staff training, and actions
- we also use the list of signees as a contact list for sharing information about developments and opportunities

Talking Points for Legislators

Reminder: know who can impact the issues you care about

 general adult education funding coordinate with LAN to support the platform! (more on that in a minute) 	 IELCE grant funding USCIS grants for programs like citizenship Resettlement Program (for refugees) ICE activities federal departments (ex: the Department of Education)

- advocate for reinstating the resettlement program
- fight to protect funding for [the program you want]

This is important because ... "



2025 Legislative Agenda

\$10 million increase in Adult Education base funding to improve access to services statewide and eliminate waiting lists for classes.

- The gross revenue per contact hour cap, current \$30 per hour, would raise to \$36 per hour, and
- The cap on growth in contact hour revenue, currently the greater of 11% or \$10,000 would be suspended for the funding year 2025-2026. For future years the cap would be raised to the greater of 11% or \$12,000.
