CASAS issued a National Promising Practice Award to the Minnesota Department of Education recognizing SPARC (Support Professional Advisory Resource Committee).

Rachel Stiglitz (SPARC Chair) and Brad Hasskamp accepted the award at the CASAS Summer Institute in California on June 11, 2025.



2025 Federal Adult Education Funding

- The federal government has not yet released 2025 Federal Adult Education grant funding to states and territories.
 These funds are typically released to states July 1.
- The U.S. Department of Education stated that the funds are under review.
- We do not know when or if the funds will be released.

2025 Federal Adult Education Funding Timeline

- **March 11:** U.S. Legislature passed continuing resolution bill, which allocates \$715 million for 2025 Federal Adult Education (and IELCE) funding nationally
- May 29: U.S. Department of Education released estimated awards for Federal Adult Education funding (but no allocations determined for IELCE).
- June 30: States received email from U.S. Department of Education that federal education funds are being reviewed by U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and that Grant Award Notifications will not be sent to states on July 1
 Includes WIOA Title II, ESSA Titles I-C, II-A, III-A, IV-A, and IV-B
- July 14: More than 20 states (including MN) filed a <u>lawsuit</u> for federal government to release the federal education funding to states

What does Federal Adult Education funding pay for?

Flow through (minimum of 82.5%)

- Contact Hour Aid (roughly 10% of grant funding for ABE consortia)
- Regional Transitions Aid
 - Online Statewide Training Courses
- Technology Aid (often used to pay for ABE consortium's licenses for SiD and statewide Distance Learning platforms)
- Low-Incidence Disability Aid

Admin and leadership (max of 17.5%)

- 5.3 MDE Adult Education Team employees (of 7 staff)
- \$214,000 for Supplemental Service Grants

Annual Tech Fees for 2025–26



- This fee covers each consortium's use of SiD and statewide distance learning (DL) licenses.
- Consortia fiscal agents received an invoice from Literacy Minnesota.

• Like last year, ABE consortia **WILL** need to pay the fee this year.

Annual Tech Fees: Distance Learning Licences

Part of the Tech fee pays for statewide distance learning (DL) licenses.

Pathways Program:

The purpose of the Pathways Program is to act as a catalyst between business and education in developing cooperative training projects that provide training, new jobs and career paths for individuals who are at or below 200% of federal poverty guidelines or those who are making the transition from public assistance to the workforce

Minnesota Job Skills Partnership

The maximum grant award for the Partnership and Pathways programs is \$400,000. A Short-Form application is available for Partnership or Pathways grant requests of up to \$50,000. The maximum grant award for Pre-Development grants is \$50,000.

Career Service Costs using ABE or IELCE Funding

Career Services provided July 2024–June 2025:

Career Service Costs

Career Services Definition

Any costs ABE providers spend providing the following:

- Outreach, intake, and orientation information;
- Pre-testing, as well as testing for other aptitudes, abilities, and supportive services needs;
- Referrals to and coordination of activities with other programs/services;
- Performance and program cost information on eligible providers of education, training, and workforce services by program and type of provider; and
- Information on availability of supportive services or assistance and appropriate referrals (e.g. child care; child support; medical or child health assistance available through the State's Medicaid program and CHIP; SNAP benefits; EITC; MFIP, and other supportive services and transportation).

Notes about FY26 State ABE Funding

- Total amount of aid for statewide system increased 2.4% from last year.
 - **~\$55,651,000** for FY26
 - ~\$54,368,000 for FY25
- Hours from May 1, 2024–April 30, 2025 were used. There was a statewide increase in hours of 9%.
 - 24-25 statewide hours: ~4,314,000
 - 23-24 statewide hours: ~3,930,000



Notes about FY26 State ABE Contact Hour Rate

- Increase in contact hours statewide resulted in a decrease in the contact hour rate.
 - Initial FY26 contact hour rate: \$8.83*
 - FY25 contact hour rate: \$9.64

* Current adjusted FY26 contact hour rate is \$8.82. This adjusted rate resulted from a calculation error that has been corrected.

Timeline for State ABE final funding calculation

- **ASAP**: Fiscal agent representative for each consortium must verify data in initial calculation of state aid. If additional errors are reported, they may be corrected in the final calculation.
- August 1: MDE will complete a final calculation.
- **Early August**: award letters will be distributed, indicating:
